Engaging in cultural and social life is one of the key aspects of integration. Prague offers a wide network of cultural venues, such as theaters, clubs, music halls, and dance venues.

- <u>The Prague City Gallery</u> provides not only permanent exhibits and exhibitions but also accompanying programs.
- <u>The National Museum</u> is the largest museum in the Czech Republic, consisting of five institutions: the Natural Science Museum, the Historical Museum, the Czech Museum of Music, the Náprstek Museum of Asian, African, and American Cultures, and the National Museum Library.
- <u>The National Gallery Prague</u> manages the largest collection of fine art in the Czech Republic, offering various events and educational programs for children and adults.
- <u>The Prague City Museum</u> offers educational programs, including lectures, guided tours, and workshops for visitors.
- Museum Kampa features a significant collection of modern and contemporary art.
- <u>The National Museum of Agriculture</u> is a great place for the whole family, with a number of interactive exhibits to keep both children and adults entertained.
- <u>The National Technical Museum</u> offers extensive exhibitions focused on the history and development of technology, covering transportation, astronomy, photography, architecture, and other scientific and technical fields. There are even technical afterschool clubs for children.
- At <u>the Municipal Library of Prague</u> you can borrow not only books in Czech and other languages but also e-readers, music, movies, and art. It also hosts cultural events, children's programs, lectures, workshops, concerts, and theater performances. Free internet access is available at all library branches.
